SUBJECT: GRANT APPLICATION FOR THE SUMMER FOOD SERVICE PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN

ISSUE: City Council consideration of the grant application to the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) for funding of the "Summer Food Service Program for Children."

RECOMMENDATIONS: That City Council authorize the City Manager to:

- (1) submit the grant application to the U.S. Department of Agriculture for its continuation funding, in the amount of \$121,000 in estimated program income; and
- (2) execute all necessary documents that may be required.

This grant application is due to the U.S. Department of Agriculture on May 17, 2002. To meet the application deadline, staff will submit the grant proposal to the agency, contingent upon City Council's approval at its April 9, 2002 meeting. It should be noted that there are no funds available in the City budget to continue these activities once the grant funds are expended.

DISCUSSION: The Summer Food Service Program, an extension of the National School Lunch and Breakfast Program, is designed to provide nutritious meals (breakfast, lunch and snacks) for children during the school vacation.

The Department of Recreation, Parks and Cultural Activities, which will administer the program, projects that 26 recreation playgrounds, camps and centers can be documented as eligible sites. As in the past, the Alexandria Public School Food Service, under contract with the Recreation Department, will prepare and deliver meals to the sites listed on the following page.

The following is pertinent to the Summer Program:

- A. **Youth to be served:** Children, age 18 and under, who attend one of the eligible sites noted above may be served. Sites selected draw attendance from geographical areas where at least one-half of the children are eligible for free or reduced price school meals under the School Lunch and Breakfast Programs.
- B. **Estimated number of children to be served: 2,069**
- C. **Program dates:** June 25, 2002 through August 16, 2002; Monday through Friday, excluding the first day of operation which is June 24 and the July 4 holiday.
- D. **Cost of lunches to children:** Free.

FISCAL IMPACT: There is no requirement for the City to provide either cash or an in-kind match for this program. However, the City is responsible for the normal administrative costs associated with this grant. These costs include financial and reporting oversight provided by the administering agency (Department of Recreation, Parks and Cultural Activities), as well as by the Office of Management and Budget and by the Finance Department. It should be noted that there are no additional monies available in the City budget to continue these activities once the estimated \$121,000 in program funds has been exhausted. The grant period is June 25, 2002 - August 16, 2002.
