MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT: SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS ORDINANCE FOR THE SUPPORT OF THE CITY GOVERNMENT FOR FY 2003

ISSUE: Consideration of a Supplemental Appropriations Ordinance for the support of the City government for FY 2003.

RECOMMENDATION: That City Council:

- (1) Pass this proposed Ordinance (Attachment 1) on first reading and schedule it for public hearing, second reading, and final passage on June 14, 2003; and
- (2) Receive the report on monetary and non-monetary donations to the City in FY 2003 (Attachment III) and thank the donors for their generosity to City programs.

DISCUSSION: This Ordinance includes the appropriation of the City and School Board's grants to their respective grant funds; the appropriation of Designated General Fund Balance to finance construction costs throughout the City in accordance with the previously approved Capital Improvement Program (CIP) funding plan; the appropriation of Equipment Replacement Retained Earnings; the appropriation of Schools' Fund Balance to pay for commitments established prior to June 30, 2002; the appropriation of revenues related to the provision of construction-related inspection services for the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office project; the appropriation of intergovernmental revenue to the Sheriff; and the appropriation of Charges for Services revenues for sewer connection fees. Staff recommends the FY 2003 Appropriations Ordinance be amended to accomplish the following:

- (1) The appropriation of grant revenues accepted or adjusted by the City in FY 2003, for specific programs, but not yet appropriated. A listing of grants is included as Attachment II and totals \$3,101,478.
- (2) The appropriation of \$2,207,544 of intergovernmental revenues received by the School Board but not yet appropriated. The School Board reported various grant adjustments

totaling a net increase of \$2,207,544. A detailed list of the School Board's grants is provided in Attachment IV.

- (3) The appropriation and transfer of \$12,300,000 from the General Fund Balance to the Capital Projects Fund as previously designated in the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report for the Fiscal Year ended June 30, 2002, and planned and approved for the FY 2003 - 2008 Approved Capital Improvement Programs, as well as for previously approved Capital Improvement Programs. Projects to be funded with this transfer will be allocated by City Council in the monthly capital allocation docket report.
- (4) The appropriation of \$200,000 of Equipment Replacement Retained Earnings not yet appropriated for vehicles to be purchased for the General Services Department in FY 2003.
- (5) The reappropriation of \$1,754,174 of the Schools Fund Balance to pay for commitments, in the form of encumbrances, established prior to, but not paid by, June 30, 2002.
- (6) The appropriation of \$438,657 of license and permit, and developer contribution, revenues related to Code Enforcement provisions and construction reviews for the Patent and Trademark Office project.
- (7) The appropriation of \$541,785 of intergovernmental revenues received for housing of federal prisoners to finance Public Safety Center perimeter security staffing costs.
- (8) The reduction of \$400,000 in the appropriation of Charges for Services revenues in the General Fund for sanitary sewer connection fees. These revenues are now being directly accounted for in the Capital Projects Fund. A corresponding decrease in the cash capital contribution is also being made.

FISCAL IMPACT: The eight sections of the Ordinance appropriate a total of \$20,143,638 as follows:

The proposed Ordinance will permit the supplemental real estate tax assessment of new buildings substantially completed after November 1 of the tax year.
