

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, on October 8, 1974, the Mayor and City Council established the Mayor's Committee for the Handicapped, later renamed the Alexandria Commission on Persons With Disabilities, to remove barriers and foster the full participation of individuals with disabilities in the community life of Alexandria; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor, City Council and the City of Alexandria have continued their commitment to citizens with disabilities by strengthening the City's services for such persons and creating an Affirmative Action Plan for the recruitment, advancement and retention of persons with disabilities in City employment; and

WHEREAS, the City of Alexandria, by this Proclamation, reaffirms its commitment to persons with disabilities and commemorates the thirteenth anniversary of the Americans With Disabilities Act, a landmark law in the fight for disability rights that has liberated the energies and talents of twenty thousand residents in Alexandria and millions of Americans with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, the City will recognize Disability Employment Awareness Month by participating in the National Disability Mentoring Day for students in Alexandria's schools on October 15, 2004, provide training on the employment of persons with disabilities for the City government's supervisors, and by supporting the City's annual training for Departmental ADA Coordinators, on October 29, 2004, to assure citizens that City programs and services are accessible to persons with disabilities as employees and beneficiaries;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, WILLIAM D. EUILLE, Mayor of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, and on behalf of the Alexandria City Council, do hereby proclaim October 2004, as:

"A DISABILITY EMPLOYMENT AWARENESS MONTH"

in the City of Alexandria, and commend the Alexandria Commission on Persons With Disabilities for providing distinguished service to our community and call upon the citizens and organizations in Alexandria to support their mission of ensuring the dignity, equality, independence and full participation of persons with disabilities in the life of our community.
