Dear Members of Council:

Due to many other civic, family and business commitments, I find that I am no longer able to devote the time and energy necessary to be an effective member of the Alexandria Citizen Corps Council (CCC). Consequently I am tendering my resignation and trust Council will refill this position.

As you know, there is no function more important for City government that providing for its residents in times of emergency. I applaud all the members of the current CCC who recognize this reality and strive to help make Alexandria as prepared as possible for such eventualities.

I have encouraged the CCC to reach out to the community via meeting and hearings to determine the reality of emergency preparedness in Alexandria. The baseline surveys I have long advocated are essential to ascertaining how prepared the community really is and to measure progress and change over time. They will also illuminate where gaps exist and surface ideas on how to correct them. Of course there will be costs but believe with imagination and creativity, these can be minimized.

In particular I applaud Councilmember Ludwig Gaines, given his recognition that emergency preparedness should be the top priority for City government and has personally undergone emergency preparedness training. His leadership in reinvigorating the City's Citizen Emergency Response Team (CERT) training program, advocacy for the creation and operation of CCC, involvement in Virginia's emergency planning, and thoughtful reflection on what makes most sense to achieve an improved state of community preparedness has been outstanding.

As a trained CERT member and active resident of Alexandria, I will continue to do what I can to promote emergency preparedness in Alexandria and elsewhere in the region. I need not remind you that in spite of the extraordinary work done by our emergency front line professionals, they will be overwhelmed when a major emergency occurs. A prepared community is essential to avoid chaos and unnecessary loss of life and property.

My wife and I will be moving to Williamsburg, Virginia, on April 11, 2006, after living in Alexandria since 1969.
