SUBJECT: BUDGET MEMORANDUM # 52 PROPOSED CIP SCHEDULE FOR ATHLETIC FIELD SYNTHETIC TURF INSTALLATION

This memo is in response to questions that Councilmen Krupicka and Lovain raised regarding public comments on the synthetic turf athletic field installation program, made during the April 9, 2007 public budget hearing.

Within the proposed FY 2008 – FY 2013 City Capital Improvement Program, the Department of Recreation, Parks, and Cultural Activity has established a schedule that will provide seven synthetic fields. In addition to the current proposed CIP plan, two additional synthetic fields are anticipated by 2010 (on the new land acquired) as a result of the Wilson Bridge mitigation (Witter/Roth Street area). Also, the City’s School system has proposed three synthetic fields in their CIP. The chart below provides a summary of artificial turf fields expected to be completed by FY 2013.

The current proposed program provides that four synthetic turf fields will be installed by the FY 2009 budget cycle. Also, the All-City Sports Facility will provide an additional synthetic turf field perhaps as early as 2009 or 2010. Based on this schedule, the City will have 12/13 synthetic turf fields completed by FY 2013. It should be noted, however, that all of the CIP plans

for future fiscal years are potentially subject to change, given the significant shortfall of identified funding for fiscal years 2009 and 2010, as well as Council's FY 2008 CIP deliberations.
