ANNUAL REPORTS FROM COUNCIL-APPOINTED BOARDS AND

COMMISSIONS

ISSUE: Receipt of the Annual Reports from Council-appointed boards and commissions.

RECOMMENDATION: That City Council: (1) receive the reports and thank the commissions for their hard work over the past year; and (2) approve the request from the Alexandria Consumer Affairs Commission to disband the Commission and request the City Attorney to prepare the necessary ordinance.

DISCUSSION: Following last fall's City Council review of board and commission operations, the Council adopted a requirement that committee annual reports be submitted with the annual attendance reports. Council also requested that each advisory group develop a strong recruitment mechanism to attract the best candidates for board and commission vacancies and a leadership plan designed to ensure turnover in each advisory group's leadership. Content requirements for committee annual reports were modified to include the recruitment and leadership plans, as well as a statement of the group's specific goals for the coming year.

This year, 26 of the 58 Council-appointed groups required to submit annual attendance reports also submitted annual reports (Attachment). Twenty-three of the groups described ongoing programs with specific goals for the coming year. Thirteen groups outlined specific plans that will ensure turnover in their committee's leadership, and 11 described recruitment plans/activities designed to encourage citizens to apply for commission vacancies. One group, the Consumer Affairs Commission, requested that it be disbanded because the core reason for its existence (review and oversight of consumer complaints) was eliminated due to a reduction in the FY 2009 budget. As a result most consumer complaints are forwarded to the State office in Richmond and are not investigated and handled by the City. Copies of all of the reports are available electronically for your review and can be accessed as part of the electronic docket item. Hard copies of the reports are available in the City Clerk's Office.

As other annual reports are received, staff will docket them for your review.
