What is SGI-USA?

What is VOV?

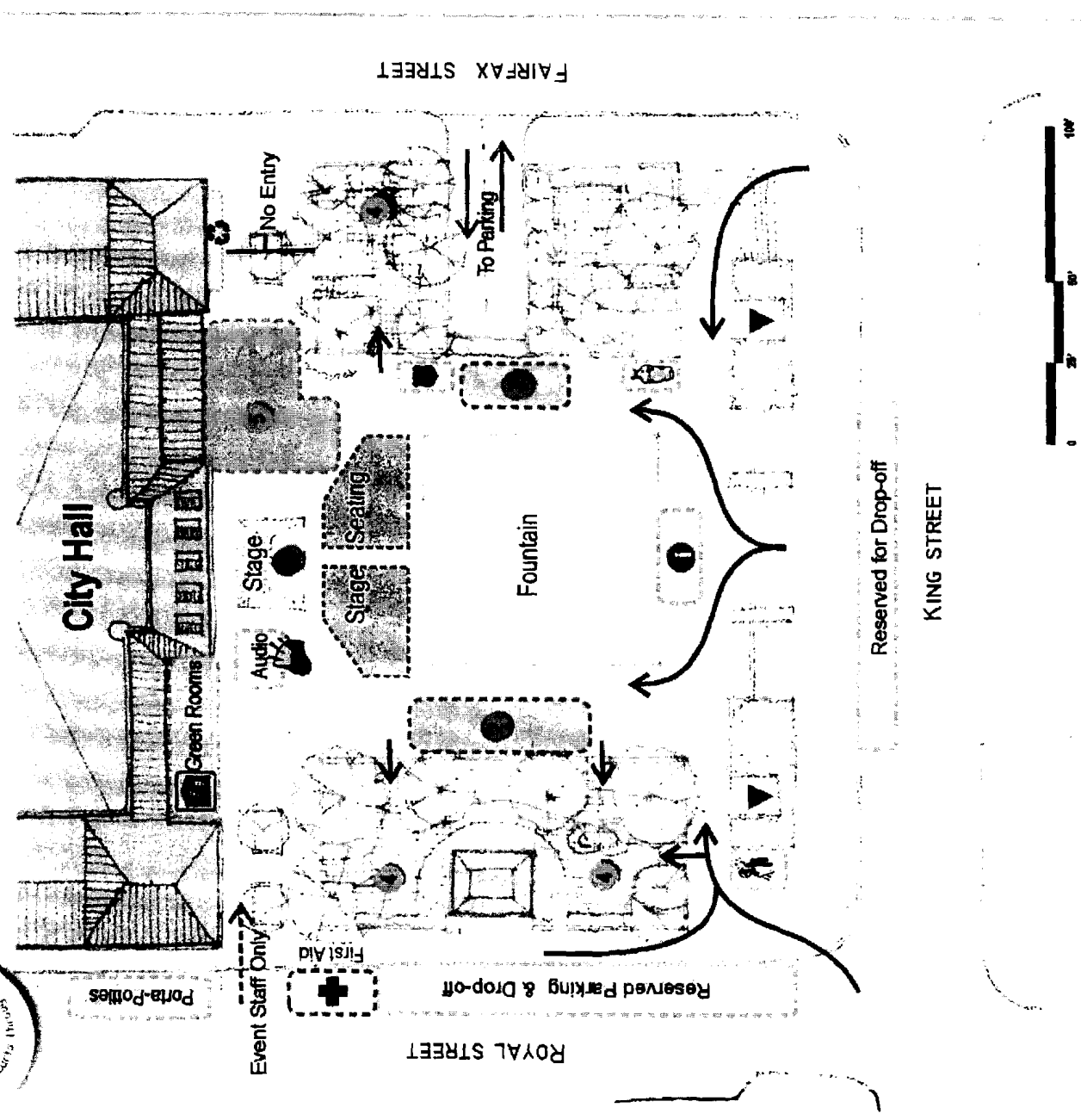

**FESTIVAL PROPOSAL
TO THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA, VIRGINIA
FOR MARKET SQUARE**

SUMMARY: The Virginia chapter of the Soka Gakkai International-USA ("SGI-USA") proposes to hold a festival on August 17, 2002 at the Market Square on King Street in Alexandria, Virginia. Festival events would include performances by local artists, exhibits, interactive activities for children, and a Dialogue Café. These activities are intended to foster a sense of the dignity of life and promote alternatives to violence.

This proposal provides details of the non-sectarian festival and brief information on the SGI-USA. The SGI-USA has hosted similar festivals in other major cities, responsibly, successfully, and safely. These festivals have benefited youth and schools in these cities, as well as our fellow citizens and city governments. References are available.

WHY A FESTIVAL? In the aftermath of the tragedy at Columbine High School, the youth of SGI-USA began *Victory Over Violence* ("VOV"), an initiative to help young people identify and counteract the root causes of violence in their lives and in their communities. Since the initiative was launched in August 1999, VOV has sponsored over 3,000 grass-roots discussions in the U.S., with more than 110,000 people "taking the pledge" to lead non-violent lives. Driven by concern about violence and disharmony in our communities, the youth of SGI-USA have led 44 VOV festivals around the country. Many of these festivals were held before the unbelievable events of September 11. Since then, with so many of our Northern Virginia citizens profoundly affected emotionally, psychologically, and spiritually, the youth of Virginia chapter are even more committed to share a powerful message of hope and peace with our local community by sponsoring this festival.

Through the use of seminars, exhibits and performances we hope to:

- 1) Raise awareness of the various forms of violence that may occur in our homes, families, classrooms and communities;
- 2) Provide opportunities for dialogue that will develop understanding;
- 3) Explore the root causes of violence and consider alternatives to violent behavior.

FESTIVAL THEME: CHOOSE PEACE: Opening Hearts Through Dialogue

MISSION STATEMENT: Choose Peace: Opening Hearts Through Dialogue. "We must never lose sight of the fact that a third millennium imbued with respect for the sanctity of life, free from nuclear arms and war, enriched with the rainbow hues of diversity, will come into being only through the efforts of empowered and responsible citizens who don't wait for someone else to take the initiative." —Daisaku Ikeda, President, Soka Gakkai International.

This proposed youth-led community festival will be a catalyst to create peace in our communities. We are determined, through our actions, to:

- Draw on the strength of diversity and build cultural bridges throughout our community;
- Value our own lives and realize our unlimited potential as individuals, recognizing that a lack of self-identity and hope for the future lie at the root of all violence;
- Nurture youth with a progressive spirit, creating beautiful and lasting bonds of friendship; and
- Seek out and unite with others who are carrying out the positive change we want to see in our society.

Empowered with new realizations of our own potential, we will dare to Choose Peace and will be motivated with a true sense of purpose to make a difference in society. We will open our own hearts and those of others through dialogue.

ABOUT SGI

WHAT IS SGI? SGI is a multi-cultural Buddhist association with more than 12 million members in 182 countries and territories worldwide. The organization in the United States is called SGI-USA (The Buddhist Society for the Creation of Value).

For SGI members, Buddhism is a practical philosophy of individual empowerment and inner transformation that enables people to develop themselves and take responsibility for their lives.

FESTIVAL PLAN

PROPOSED FESTIVAL EVENTS:

- Tree Planter Conferral to the City of Alexandria, honoring the lives lost on September 11th. (The Mayor of Alexandria, and military personnel from the Pentagon will be invited for this ceremony)
- Performances by local musicians, poets, singers and dancers and others representing the artistic traditions of many cultures and countries
- Exhibit honoring the lives of Dr. Martin Luther King, Mahatma Gandhi and Daisaku Ikeda
- Games and activities for children and the young at heart
- A Dialogue Café which will feature interactive workshops and conversations on ways to end intolerance and violence

FESTIVAL LAYOUT: The event will consist of three major areas: the Stage Area, Exhibit and Dialogue Area and Games Area. A Command Center and First Aid station will be available. In addition, security personnel can be secured to assist local law enforcement officials if necessary.
