**ISSUE:** Consideration of a Request to Refer to the City Council Naming Committee the Proposed Change of the Name of the Alexandria Black History Resource Center to the Alexandria Black History Museum.

**RECOMMENDATION:** That City Council refer the proposal to change the name of the Alexandria Black History Resource Center to the Alexandria Black History Museum to the City Naming Committee for consideration and submission of a recommendation to Council.

**<u>DISCUSSION</u>**: Since its inception in 1983, the City facility located at 638 North Alfred Street has been called the Alexandria Black History Resource Center. The use of the term "resource center" no longer appropriately describe the activities that take place at this institution, which collects, preserves, and interprets the history of the African American community in Alexandria and Northern Virginia. In a short while the Alexandria Black History Resource Center will be seeking accreditation from the American Association of Museums. The use of the term "museum" within the title of the institution more accurately depicts what the institution is all about.

Many residents, friends groups of the institution, members of City boards and commissions and other Black History organizations support the change of the name from Resource Center to Museum. Letters of support are attached.

Under the policy for naming City buildings, name changes like this are to be considered by the Naming Committee. Thus, I recommend that the proposed name change be referred to the committee for consideration and submission of a recommendation to Council.


