
Dear Pat,

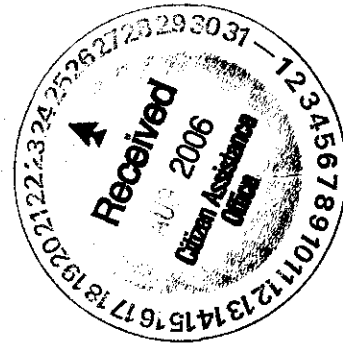

you do on behalf of us with disabilities.



Below is my formal resignation note, if you want to share it with the Board. I really hate to leave, but I know I'm not able to give it the time and attention it deserves right now. I know you understand.

I really do hope to stay in touch -- (Bonny, I'd still very much enjoy doing lunch!) And I still intend to be supportive of the SSAB activities when possible. In fact, I'll see you at the SCAN fundraiser on the 17th.

Dear Suzanne and Bonny -

After much thought, I have decided not to re-apply for another term on the Alexandria Social Services Advisory Board (SSAB) when my current term expires in September. I plan to return in a few years, but right now with both of my young children in grade school, my time and attention (what little is left after a full-time job) needs to be with them. In my six years on SSAB as a member and as Chair, and also as Chair of the Alexandria Child Welfare Partnership, it is very rewarding to have accomplished as much as we did:

- * Developing the Our Kids- Our Business (OK) Campaign to promote child protection, foster parenting, and adoption,
- * Developing the 2004 Resource Guide for Alexandria's Children, Youth and Families provided to all Alexandria families with school age children (and the 2004 Spanish version),
- * Supporting the concept that eventually became the kid-friendly, coordinated-services Child Advocacy Center for children in child protective services,
- * Initiating the successful effort to pass legislation ensuring background checks for all adults in homes of children under child protective services in Virginia,
- * Attempting to obtain better funding rates for foster parenting through the Virginia legislature, and
- * Helping the City improve its child protective services policies.

The Board members and the entire staff of the Department of Human Services have been wonderful to work with, but I particularly want to thank: Suzanne for her patience with the board members as its high turnover requires endless repetitions of information; Paulette Jarrett for her outstanding support for the Board; and Janice Pritchett for the incredibly outstanding work she produced for the resource guide. Bonny will be a great Chair for the Board, and I truly regret that I'm leaving during her tenure. She is a legend at the U.S. Food and Nutrition Service and I was looking forward to working more with her.

I remain committed to the goals of the Board, particularly the protection of Alexandria's children. Please keep me on any appropriate mailing list for fundraisers, etc. After taking a break of a couple of years, I expect to re-apply to the Board, so this isn't "Good-bye," it's "See you later" - and please keep in touch!
