

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the month of April 2001 marks the thirty-third anniversary of Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, the Federal Fair Housing Law, which, as amended, provides for equal opportunity for all persons in the sale, rental, and financing of housing and prohibits housing discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin; and

WHEREAS, the Alexandria Human Rights Ordinance is one of the strongest fair housing laws in Virginia, prohibiting discrimination in housing on the basis of race, color, sex, religion, ancestry, national origin, marital status, age, sexual orientation, or disability; and

WHEREAS, the City of Alexandria has consistently opposed all forms of housing discrimination and continues to provide strong leadership in furthering fair housing goals; and

WHEREAS, the City, in 1987, established a Fair Housing Testing Program which monitors rental housing practices, and files complaints of discrimination when evidence is gathered to ensure equal housing opportunity for all; and

WHEREAS, the City of Alexandria and its elected leaders urge all agencies, institutions, and individuals, public and private, to support the policies and principles of the Fair Housing Act and the City of Alexandria Human Rights Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, KERRY J. DONLEY, Mayor of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, and on behalf of the Alexandria City Council, do hereby proclaim the month of April 2001, as:

"FAIR HOUSING MONTH"

in the City of Alexandria, Virginia.
