



Overview of EMS



- First Aid trained fire fighters provided basic life support and transportation to hospital.
- Emergency call volume
 1966 6,229
- Emergency call volume 1977 – 8,755




1976 - 1978



- Hired the first Paramedics
- Two Medic units staffed
- Advanced cardiac care provided outside the hospital
- 1977 Third Medic Unit staffed



Key Events





- EMS call volume continues to increase
 - 1966 >6,229 (2 non-ALS units)
 - 1977 >8,755 (3 ALS UNITS)
 - -1988 > 9,518 (4 ALS units)
- 1988 Fourth Medic Unit staffed




Increasing complexity of Pre-hospital care 1977 - present


- Advanced Airway Control Procedures
 - (Esophageal Airway 1978 > Endotracheal Intubation 1985 > Cricothyroidotomy 1995 > Rapid Sequence Intubation 1999)
- Advanced Electrocardiograms
 - (Three Lead 1976 > Twelve Lead 1992 > Twelve Lead Diagnostic Quality 1998)
- Numerous Medications
 - (Originally carried only about one dozen medications 1976 > Now carrying More than 40 different medications [2000])
- Expanded Medical Protocols
 - (Basic Cardiac protocols 1976 > New and expanded treatment protocols to include use of all listed above; most without radio contact with the Emergency Department physician [2000])






Number of Incidents by Day of the Week 2000



EMS Incidents By Time of Day Year Ending Nov 2000








City population age increases


EMS transports by age




Alexandria EMS Patients By Age




November 1999 – February 2001

- Hospital closed
- Area hospitals become saturated
- Hospitals begin "reroute" of patients to distant hospitals

Definitions:

- Ed reroute = Emergency Department normally closed to "stable" patients
- CCU reroute = Emergency department closed to "stable" patients in need of admission to critical care








FY 2000 EMS Transports by diagnosis






- Alexandria Hospital gives up Trauma status - 1995
- Virginia State requires trauma patients go to a Trauma facility
 - Extended transport time and return to City



Alexandria Response Time Standard

5th Medic Proposal



"Citizens of Alexandria deserve the best chance to survive in the event of cardiac or respiratory arrest. Therefore, EMS resources in the City must be provided at a level that places ALS providers at the patient in 8 minutes or less at least 90% of the time."

Components of Response Times

5th Medic Proposal

Citizen calls 911

Medic Unit arrives at patient (1.5 minutes)

Travel time (4 minutes)

Medic Unit turns out for call (1 minute)

Police answer call and transfer to Fire

Call received:
clarification
validation
(1 minute)

Fire dispatches call (30 seconds)




Actual Travel Time to Zone Boxes





Primary area performance of assigned Medic Unit


% of Calls Responded to by 1st Due Medic Unit




Comparison of Jurisdictions FY 2000






Number of occasions with Zero or only one Medic Unit in City







EMS Responses Provided from OtherJurisdictions






Benefits of 5th Medic Unit

5th Medic Proposal

- Increased ability to meet the response time standard
- Mitigates delay due to reroute and trauma transports
- Improves opportunity to save the lives of cardiac and respiratory arrest victims
- Reduces reliance on outside jurisdictions
- Reduces prime unit response delays
