SUBJECT:

SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE FOR THE SUPPORT OF

THE CITY GOVERNMENT FOR FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2006

**ISSUE:** Consideration of a Supplemental Appropriation Ordinance for the support of the City government for Fiscal Year (FY) 2006.

## **RECOMMENDATION:** That City Council:

- (1) Pass this proposed Ordinance (Attachment I) on first reading and schedule it for public hearing, second reading, and final passage on June 17, 2006; and
- (2) Receive the report on monetary and non-monetary donations to the City in FY 2006 (Attachment III) and thank the donors for their generosity to City programs.

**DISCUSSION:** Near the end of each fiscal year a Supplemental Appropriation Ordinance is presented for Council consideration in order to reflect additional grant revenues, donations and other technical appropriation adjustments previously planned but not yet enacted. This Ordinance includes the appropriation of the City and School Board's grants to their respective grant funds; the appropriation of Designated General Fund Balance to finance construction costs throughout the City in accordance with the previously approved Capital Improvement Program (CIP) funding plan; the appropriation of Equipment Replacement Retained Earnings; the appropriation of Schools' Fund Balance to pay for commitments established but not paid prior to June 30, 2005; the appropriation of Donation, Housing and Sanitary Sewer Fund revenues; and the appropriation of Intergovernmental revenue. Staff recommends the FY 2006 Appropriations Ordinance be amended to accomplish the following:

- (1) The appropriation of grant revenue accepted or adjusted by the City in FY 2006, for specific programs, but not yet appropriated. A listing of grants is included as Attachment II and totals \$1,707,292.
- (2) The appropriation of \$519,765 of intergovernmental revenue received by the School Board but not yet appropriated. The School Board reported various grant adjustments

- totaling a net increase of \$519,765. A detailed list of the Schools' grants is provided in Attachment IV.
- (3) The appropriation and transfer of \$4,732,890 from the General Fund Balance to the Capital Projects Fund as previously designated in the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report for the Fiscal Year ended June 30, 2005, and planned initially and approved for the FY 2006 2011 Approved Capital Improvement Program.
- (4) The appropriation of \$440,315 of Equipment Replacement Retained Earnings not yet appropriated for vehicles and other equipment to be purchased in FY 2006.
- (5) The reappropriation of \$976,614 of the School Fund Balance to pay for commitments, in the form of encumbrances, established prior to, but not paid by June 30, 2005.
- (6) The appropriation of \$44,938 of Donation Revenue related to Summer Jobs for Youth and the Court of Dreams Programs.
- (7) The appropriation and transfer of \$1,233,413 from the General Fund to the Special Revenue Fund for Office of Housing operations to complete the transition of accounting for the Office of Housing in a Special Revenue Fund.
- (8) The appropriation of \$1,687,029 to establish the Sanitary Sewer Special Revenue Fund per page 9-152 of the 2007 proposed budget. The total amount of sanitary sewer activities is \$11,064,459 of which \$1,112,971 remains in the General Fund for debt service associated with sewer projects and the balance of \$8,264,459 which has already been appropriated for sewer projects in the Capital Projects Fund. General Fund appropriations are being reduced by \$1,687,029 to reflect the transfer of sanitary sewer operating expenditures from the General Fund to the Sanitary Sewer Special Revenue Fund.
- (9) The appropriation of \$36,331 of Intergovernmental revenue related to the Sheriff for the State Criminal Alien Assistance Program.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** The nine sections of the Ordinance appropriate a total of \$11,378,587 as follows:
