It is with regret that I submit my resignation from the city's Commission on Information Technology, effective immediately. Although the primary reason for my resignation is my assumption of leadership responsibilities with a leading civic association, I also believe that the Commission has become a largely ineffectual body during my two-year tenure. I would strongly encourage you, as our elected leaders, to review the charter and activities of the Commission to determine whether it is indeed serving an important and needed function in our city and whether it should continue in its current form and under its current leadership. Areas where the Commission could add true value include a more active consultative role throughout the budget/capital planning process, including reviewing and providing input to city staff on the scope, resources, and schedules for major technology capital investments at the beginning of budget development; and working groups providing guidance to specific areas of interest (e.g., wireless technology, security, disaster recovery and contingency planning, enterprise architecture) to city staff and elected officials. With this more targeted, active approach, the Commission and the city would make far better use of the Commission's skilled citizen members, all of whom are outstanding information technology professionals.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve as a member of the Commission. I hope that changes can be made to the Commission that will make it a vital presence in our city.
