BUDGET MEMORANDUM #30 : SPECIAL EVENTS - CITYWIDE

SUMMARY OF COSTS

This memo is in response to Mayor Euille's request for a detailed listing of the costs of special events in the City. Many different City departments provide support to run these special events throughout Alexandria. When appropriate and based on existing City policies, the City seeks reimbursement from the event sponsors in order to help cover costs. In sum, staff calculates the City spent \$834,416 in FY 2006 to support special events, of which \$182,911 (22%) was reimbursed by the special event sponsor. The net City subsidy was \$651,505.

Departmental Support Roles

The primary departments involved in supporting special events are Parks and Recreation, Fire, Code Enforcement, Police, T&ES, Health, and General Services. Each plays an integral role in delivering these special events.

- Parks and Recreation has two very distinct roles in supporting special events. First, the
 Special Events section of RPCA helps plan for and coordinate the majority of special events
 occurring in Alexandria. They provide a central contact point for groups wanting to hold
 events and then work with other City departments to provide appropriate support. The Parks
 Division provides support at events by assisting with event set-up and take down, trash
 pickup, and preparation of park facilities.
- The Fire Department provides first aid services and coordinated communications services. Code Enforcement inspects and issues permits for these events with the goal of ensuring a safe environment.
- The Police Department provides security, crowd control, and traffic flow.

- Transportation and Environmental Services controls street closures, street cleaning, waste management, and parking restriction (closing parking spaces and covering meters). Through DASH, T&ES also offers transit services when needed.
- General Services sets up indoor City facilities and Market Square when needed.
- The Health Department's role is to regulate food and food vendors at special events.
- Risk Management provides legal counsel, ensuring events are properly insured and the City's liability is minimized.

City Sponsorship/Support of Special Events

Most special events occurring within the City receive some level of sponsorship from the City. That sponsorship can range from the complete planning and operation of an event, to indirect support costs (Police and Fire coverage, street cleaning, trash pickup, etc.), to direct funding for the sponsor of an event. A typical event receives a combination of these differing types of support. For example, the City provides \$5,400 in direct funding to the event sponsor and around \$40,000 in various indirect support costs for the St. Patrick's Day Parade each year.

Only around 38% of special event sponsors provided any level of reimbursement to the City to help cover costs in FY 2006. Many special events are not currently charging any sort of admission fee and would not have the capability to help defray City costs without changing this practice. Even with these limitations, the City was able to recover around 31% (typically in the 30-33% range) of its total event-specific special events costs in FY 2006.

The Police Department had the highest cost recovery rate in the City (54.5%), while the Special Events section of RPCA had the lowest cost recovery rate (12.2%). Most departments fell somewhere around the 30% cost recovery range.

- The Police Department specifically budgeted \$110,000 in FY 2006 for overtime costs associated with special events. With this funding and reimbursed costs from event sponsors, the Police Department is able to fully cover its costs most years.
- RPCA budgets money specifically for supporting special events as well. The special events section of RPCA had an FY 2006 budget of approximately \$447,000. Some of this funding supported specific special events and some funded the administrative oversight of Citywide special events. The Department also budgeted \$77,000 to directly sponsor or co-sponsor special events.
- The Parks Division had a special events overtime budget of \$29,000.


• Other departments either recovered their costs from the event sponsors or absorbed the costs in their General Fund budgets.

Overall, the City spent approximately \$834,416 (including administrative oversight) and the overall special events budgets totalled \$676,000. This yielded a budget deficit of about \$158,000 in FY 2006.

Overall City Costs

Total City expenditures for supporting special events (including administrative overhead) in FY 2006 were about \$834,416. The largest shares of this total belong to the Parks and Recreation Department (\$510,000), the Police Department (\$212,000), and Transportation and Environmental Services (\$66,000), with other departments spending between \$5,000 and \$20,000 each.

The highest-funded special events in FY 2006 were the City's Birthday Celebration (\$71,776), Ethnic Festivals (\$74,540), the St. Patrick's Day Parade (\$45,400), and the Scottish Christmas Walk (\$22,339 net City cost). These four events alone constituted more than 25% of the total costs of all special events in FY 2006.

After recovering approximately \$183,000 from event sponsors, the overall net City cost for special events was about \$652,000 in FY 2006. The major events that are largely reimbursed were the Jamestown 400th Anniversary (\$53,866), the Hard Times Café Music Festival (\$38,072) and the Fall Arts Festival (\$20,851).

Future Actions Necessary

Although the City budgeted slightly more for special events activities in total in FY 2006 the actual expenditures, some rearranging of funding needs to occur in the future. Properly budgeting for these support costs within each department will ensure that no department is forced to absorb these costs and placed at a disadvantage. Also, not all departments have been reporting their costs for reimbursable events. Finally, City Staff will be addressing the need to develop a consistent set of policies for cost recovery and proposing them for Council consideration at a future date following consultation with major special event sponsors. City staff also will be reviewing our internal procedures for measuring and charging for special event costs determined to be appropriate by Council-endorsed policies.
