CONSIDERATION OF A REQUEST TO HOLD THE KING STREET MILE RACE ON KING STREET FROM MARKET SQUARE TO UNION STATION ON MONDAY, DECEMBER 31, 2007 FROM 5:00 PM TO 5:20 PM TO OPEN

FIRST NIGHT ALEXANDRIA

<u>ISSUE</u>: City Council consideration of a request to hold the King Street Mile Race on King Street from Market Square to Union Station on Monday, December 31, 2007 from 5:00 pm to 5:20 pm to open First Night Alexandria.

RECOMMENDATION: That City Council permit an exception to the Major Events Policy to allow First Night Alexandria to sponsor the King Street Mile Race in Old Town scheduled for December 31, 2007, to open the annual First Night Alexandria celebration.

DISCUSSION: Each year First Night Alexandria looks for a signature event to draw attention to the nonalcoholic family event. First Night Alexandria features entertainment in various locations in Old Town and concludes the event at midnight with fireworks. For the 2007 event, First Night Alexandria is proposing to hold the King Street Mile Race to serve as the evening's opening event. Runners will start at Market Square and proceed west on King Street to Union Station, 1101 Callahan Drive (Attachment 4). It is envisioned that this distance will attract both elite runners and high school students. In addition, the race will be limited to approximately 200 participants, and will not be open to walkers, strollers, dogs, etc., in order to ensure the least amount of impact on traffic and the community.

The limited number of runners, and the proposed distance of the race will not require King Street to be closed for the duration of the race or the removal of parking, but will allow for rolling closures of King Street to further lesson the impact on traffic. Trucks with lights will lead the race in order to light the route for the runners as a safety measure. Volunteers will be on each block of the race route to assist with motorists who have parked along the route to enhance their safety, as well as the runners.

Staff recommends that City Council approve the King Street Mile Race. The Upper King Street Neighborhood Association (Attachment 1), the Old Town Business and Professional Association (Attachment 2), and the Old Town Civic Association (Attachment 3) support the race. The Special Events Committee also supports the race.

FISCAL IMPACT: Costs associated with City Services will be paid for by First Night Alexandria.


