SUBJECT:

SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE FOR THE SUPPORT OF

THE CITY GOVERNMENT FOR FY 2010

ISSUE: Consideration of a Supplemental Appropriation Ordinance for the support of the City government for FY 2010.

RECOMMENDATION: That City Council pass this proposed Ordinance (Attachment 1) on first reading and schedule it for public hearing, second reading, and final passage on Saturday April 17, 2010.

<u>DISCUSSION:</u> This Ordinance includes the appropriation of City Grants; the appropriation of Capital Project Fund Revenues; the appropriation of General Fund Balance Money; and the appropriation of DASH revenue.

Staff recommends the FY 2010 Approved Budget be amended to accomplish the following:

- (1) The appropriation of grant revenue accepted or adjusted by the City in FY 2010, for specific programs, but not yet appropriated. A listing of grants is included as Attachment II and totals \$5,338,910. Significant grants included in this appropriation are two BRAC-related grants (\$612,000 for the Beauregard Corridor Plan and \$178,677 for job placement), \$2,352,860 for Phase III of the Intelligent Transportation System (ITS)/Highway Video Project, and \$936,955 for the Neighborhood Stabilization Program. Additional smaller grants totaling \$1.5 million are described in the attachment.
- (2) The appropriation of \$2,352,860 of Capital Improvement Funds for the ITS Integration Project to improve traffic flow in the City. This appropriates the special revenue (grant) funds described above for the ITS Integration Project into the Capital Improvement Fund.
- (3) The appropriation of \$11,238 of Developer Contributions and SUP Conditions of Capital Improvement Program Funds. This appropriation includes: \$2,150 for street cans and \$9,088 for the Water Quality Improvement Fund.

- (4) The appropriation of American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funds accepted by departments, but not yet appropriated in FY 2010. A listing of grants is included (Attachment 3) and totals \$4,522,800. Two significant grants are reflected here: \$3,150,000 to the Transportation and Environmental Services Department for bike trail connection and alternative fuel trolleys and \$1,372,800 allocated to several departments for Energy Efficiency and Conservation. Projects to be funded include energy audits and retrofits, a green fleet program, a revolving green loan program and green jobs training.
- (5) The appropriation of \$125,000 of General Fund balance for the Homeless Intervention Program to support the continuation of client services in FY 2010.
- (6) The appropriation of \$208,789 of General Fund to the Special Revenue Fund for DASH for computer equipment (\$8,789) and the DASH service cuts restoration appropriated from contingent reserves in January (\$200,000).
- (7) The appropriation of \$200,000 of General Fund to the Housing Fund for the Homeownership Assistance Program to assist home buyers in the purchase of distressed properties. (These funds were recently allocated from Contingent Reserves. This action moves the funds from the General Fund to the Housing Fund.)
