ORDINANCE TO AMEND NOTICE PROVISIONS FOR COMPETITIVE

SEALED BIDDING AND COMPETITIVE NEGOTIATION

<u>ISSUE</u>: Consideration of an ordinance to amend the public notice provisions for competitive sealed bidding and competitive negotiation processes.

RECOMMENDATION: That City Council pass the ordinance on first reading and schedule it for public hearing, second reading and final passage on Saturday, September 12.

DISCUSSION: The Procurement Department seeks to update the notice requirements for its competitive sealed bidding and competitive negotiation processes to reflect changes in standard governmental procurement practice as a result of technological advances that have occurred since the current notice ordinances were enacted in 1983. As do almost all local governments in today's environment, the City relies primarily on technology solutions and services to advertise opportunities to business with the City. Current opportunities to bid and propose are listed on the City's external web site, and firms and individuals are directly notified of solicitations of interest to them through the City's web-based e-procurement system. Through the City's e-procurement system, interested parties can download Request for Proposal (RFP) and Invitation to Bid (ITB) documents and automatically receive amendments and clarifications as an RFP or ITB process proceeds. Notices of opportunities to bid and propose on City contracts, copies of the solicitation documents, and amendments to the solicitations are also distributed at no cost to the City through several commercial, web-based services.

This ordinance would delete the current paragraph (b) of Sec. 3-3-36, which dates to a time now passed when the City and other local governments relied heavily on newspaper advertisements to inform firms and individuals of bidding opportunities. This ordinance also would amend paragraph (a) of Sec. 3-3-36 and Sec. 3-3-64, which currently require that public notice of bidding and proposal opportunities, respectively, be published in a newspaper of general circulation at least ten days prior to the receipt of offers.

The amended ordinance would provide that public notice of bidding and proposal opportunities be published in a newspaper of general publication a reasonable time prior to the receipt of offers. Given the speed at which information and documents now flow, a requirement for a fixed number of days is an anachronism and could unnecessarily delay the fulfillment of an immediate need for a good or service by a City department.


