Dear Honorable Mayor and Members of Council:

Almost one year ago, the Environmental Health Work Group was established as the fourth work group of the Partnership for a Healthier Alexandria. With over 250 members, the *Partnership* is dedicated to promoting a safe and healthy Alexandria through coalition building, collaborative planning and community action. The *Partnership* was formed in April 2006 to focus on health concerns that arose from Alexandria's first Community Health Assessment and now addresses a range of health priorities including obesity, second hand smoke, mental health anti-stigma, and substance abuse prevention.

The primary goal of the Environmental Health Work Group is to develop a set of priorities, strategies and interventions with respect to two broad areas of public policy: Respiratory Health and the Built Environment. With respect to the built environment, we're particularly concerned about how planning, zoning, and transportation impacts health.

We are writing today with respect to VDOT's recommendations to improve the Seminary Road interchange as part of the BRAC construction project. Some of the proposals encroach on Winkler Botanical Preserve, including one that would destroy nearly half of the preserve. <u>We believe that any of the proposals that</u> <u>impact Winkler Botanical Preserve would have serious</u> <u>health impacts for the residents of Alexandria.</u>

The obesity epidemic is a serious concern in general and particularly in Alexandria, where according to a 2007 Healthy Weight Collaborative survey conducted by Inova Health System **over 43% of our children are obese or overweight**. The *Partnership's* ACHIEVE Planning Team, a group funded by the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention and dedicated to addressing obesity in children, spent the last five months further investigating this issue through focus groups and GIS mapping. According to their findings, parents find a lack of recreation space, both indoor and outdoor, a major barrier to encouraging physical activity. There are clusters of children in Alexandria, particularly in low income neighborhoods in the West End, where the preserve is located, where there seems to be higher rates of overweight and obesity.

Because of its location in an underserved part of Alexandria, **the Winkler Botanical Preserve is a critical recreation space** for these children and their families. There is a current shortage of park space per capita in Alexandria, particularly in the West End of Alexandria. The Preserve is regularly visited by schools in the city. It is our understanding that the summer camp programs at the

preserve are regularly over subscribed. And both of these facts underscore the need for natural spaces.

We understand that this is a complex decision for the city and state. If we can be of any assistance in understanding the full impact of the project on Alexandria citizens, do not hesitate to call us. The *Partnership for a Healthier Alexandria* and its work groups will continue to follow the potential health impacts of this process and stay engaged on this issue.

	Dear Mayor, Vice Mayor, and Council Members,
	It has come to my attention
	that City Council will be making a final decision on the various VDOT
	proposals, which may or may not comprise and/or destroy the Winkler
	Botanical Preserve, to build a transportation medium to the new Department
	of Defense buildings at Mark Center at the City Council meeting on
	12/12/2009. While we should avoid excessively complicating the logistics of
	the Department of Defense facilities at Mark Center, we should not do so at
	the expense of the Winkler Botanical Preserve. The Preserve serves the city
	as a natural setting well. Our residents can enjoy the refreshing
	tranquility of a rural area right in our own backyard. Our youth, through
	school field trips and private desires, can learn about nature, the
	environment, and how we affect it from a firsthand perspective. They have
	the opportunity to build a connection to the natural world that is so often
	forgotten in an urban upbringing. It is true that there are other natural

settings in the city. It must also be noted that few of these locations have such large properties and varied landscapes like Winkler's. If you

cannot be swayed by this argument, let us take a new angle. Alexandria, in all its glory, is a city defined by several things. Its proximity to the nexus of the federal government has certainly been very influential in its development. Other examples include its unique situation as a very densely populated and "urban" suburb, its rich history, and its diversity. Our city is also defined by its dedication to the environment and to retaining a natural atmosphere in a developed area. If anyone doubts this, they need only look at the recent policy of the city to see my point. Our city just spent over one hundred million dollars on the new T.C.

Williams High School, a state-of-the-art building that meets environmental Comments: standards. We provide recycling services to city residents. If nothing else, our city is aesthetically pleasing because of its "greenness." As a suburb so close to a major urban city, we must not forget this. If nothing else, City Council should not vote for any measures that results in the partial or complete destruction of Winkler just to be consistent in its policy. We should not be environmentally-friendly only when the construction of new, "green" high school allows the city and its school system to promote itself as environmentally-friendly. If we do that, we should also be environmentally-friendly when the media is not taking note and there are no marketing incentives. While the city prospers in times of plenty and largely rides our times of scarcity unscathed because of the presence of the federal government, this dependency should not dictate our policy. We are beholden to the federal government, as we should be, but we should not change the character of our city and the things that make us cherish our

> locality just to convenience the federal government. Part of the American tradition is the act of taking pride in our local communities and retaining local flavor. Winkler is part of this local flavor and we should not

actively seek its demise. I am not suggesting environmentalism for the sake of environmentalism. What I am suggesting is that the city sticks to its roots and be a good example of a city that practices responsible environmental policy. I hope that you, as City Council, will take this into consideration if and when you vote on any proposal that would harm Winkler.

The Board of Directors of Brookville-Seminary Valley Civic Association, Inc. ("BSVCA") submits these comments for your consideration in determining what requests to make to the Virginia Department of Transportation ("VDOT") regarding potential options for direct access from 1-395 to Mark Center. As discussed below, we request that City Council ("Council") adopt all of the recommendations on this subject proposed by the Transportation Commission ("Commission"), except the one suggesting that Council direct VDOT to pursue a design option at Sanger Avenue providing direct access to 1-395, and we also urge Council to instruct T&ES and VDOT to identify and evaluate additional direct access options that are consistent with the BRAC Advisory Group's Guiding Principles (e.g., protect the Winkler Preserve).

The BSVCA, which is comprised of individuals from several hundred households in the West End of the City, is a non-profit organization that seeks to promote the best interests of Alexandrians. Given the proximity of Brookville-Seminary Valley to Mark Center and I-395, BRAC-related transportation and traffic mitigation issues are of great interest to our members. In fact, as you know, we submitted comments to Council on the subject in connection with the preliminary public hearing that was held on November 21, 2009, and we also submitted comments to the Commission in advance of its hearing on December 2, 2009.

Consistent with our comments, the Commission voted to recommend that Council, among other things: (1) direct VDOT to analyze further alternatives A1 and A2 (neither of which involves infringing upon the Winkler Preserve); (2) instruct VDOT to eliminate from consideration any direct access alternatives that would adversely impact the Winkler Preserve; (3) adopt the BRAC Advisory Group's Guiding Principles and urge VDOT to consider them when evaluating options; and (4) send a letter to Duke Realty requesting that the Council-approved local road improvements be completed as quickly as possible. We urge Council to adopt these recommendations. 

	West Civic Association meeting, we learned that the Army and developers
	commenced construction which is now well underway without first
	figuring out how 6,400 new workers would be able to get to the complex each
	day (even taking into account the 40% the Army insists will take public
	or shared transportation, which remains to be seen). The triple left turn
	lanes from Seminary onto Beauregard and the double left from Beauregard
	onto Mark Center Drive will be a Band-Aid approach to a situation that
	requires major surgery.
	The plans now call for cars to be routed through

a Rube Goldberg-type maze to the parking garages. A VDOT engineeer said

that only 300 cars PER HOUR can be processed into one garage under this

scenario -- thus, it would take four or five hours to get the vehicles

into the garage. Moreover, the new IDA building that will be constructed

next door to the existing facility is expected to house another 1,000 or

so workers. BRAC-133 is not the only consideration in terms of access.

Mark Center is a large area encompassing many buildings that house

thousands of workers already. They, too, will need to be able to get to

and from work.

Direct access clearly would alleviate some -- but not all

-- of the problem. And now we learn that one of the alternatives for

direct access would entail slicing the north end off the Winkler Botanical

Preserve. Our community does not want this to happen. The Army and the

Comments:

developers have created this problem and they should be responsible for

coming up with a solution that does not decimate this local treasure -- not

to mention the wildlife that make it home.

Yet it would not surprise

most of us if this is exactly what happens, considering the lack of

foresight and planning that has gone into BRAC-133 thus far. A workable

solution must be found, and even those of us who are opposed to

encroachment on the preserve can see the writing on the wall. We

therefore urge Council and City officials to ensure that if part of the

preserve is indeed used to provide access to the site, an equal or greater

amount of open space is exacted from the developers at the other end of

the preserve, to result in a net gain. This seems more than reasonable,

in light of the fact that JBG plans to raze the apartment complexes south

of the preserve in order to build new homes in that area.

We were also

dismayed to discover that funding sources for access have not yet been

established. Our residents should not have to bear the cost of ensuring

that BRAC-133 employees are able to get to work -- this is something that

should have been considered long ago, during the site selection process.

The City absolutely must ensure that adequate funding from the

developers, the Army, and other federal sources will pay for this road

work.

It is incumbent on our elected officials and the City to ensure

that any solutions and decisions be viable, workable, and address the

concerns and needs of the community.

Comments on options for BRAC traffic, City Council Public meeting 12/12/2009 Docket #4 Alice Cave, 3736 Gunston Road

My name is Alice Cave and I am a resident of Parkfairfax. I am writing in support of our neighbors at Seminary Hills concerning a possible direct access to the BRAC-133 installation from I-395.

- The BRAC-133 project will provide no tax revenue to the City, and yet there will be a lot of consequences in terms of infrastructure to try to deal with the transportation issues. DoD should be forced to pay for all transportation improvements in the area.
- The best option is to keep traffic off the already failing Seminary Road exit and provide a dedicated, direct access from I-395. Desirable attributes for this access would include HOV access, service to places beyond the BRAC-133 installation, no encroachment on the Winkler Preserve, an efficient, sensible solution and not just the cheapest option. Also, the public should have a chance to provide input to the proposed solution before a choice is made. However this is handled, the Army should pay for this access in its entirety. At this time, I do not think any of the seven proposed options is adequate. These options either encroach on Winkler or they only serve BRAC, or they encroach on the property of other landowners there, for example IDA.
- Please tell VDOT "none of the above," and keep working on a better solution. The wonderful BRAC Advisory Committee should be a help there. Please enlist the support of our Congressman and Senators to get Federal funding for whatever solution is desired.
- Finally, I cannot emphasize enough that transportation solutions for the BRAC-133 installation should not be allowed to take any more of the Winkler preserve. I remember working at Mark Center in the 1990s, when the preserve was much larger. I often took walks at lunchtime through the beautiful trees. Now much of this area has been extensively developed with businesses and housing. We need to make sure we preserve what is left of this lovely area. Once it is gone.



	I am a new citizen of the Shirley Forrest area
	of Alexandria and received information about Wednesday's meeting about the
	army installation off of Seminary and Beauregard. I was very upset to hear
	that the most viable option for new entry involves destroying a large
	section of the Winkler Botanical Preserve. I wish to convey my
	dissatisfaction at this option. I understand that another option includes
	expanding the preserve southwards but this requires the agreement of the
	current owners of this land JBG. If this option is available I feel that
	it may be the best situation for all involved.
	No matter what I insist
	that the new Army and IDA facilities MUST have direct access from 395. The
	off ramps from 395 to Seminary Road are already crowded, especially at peak
	hours, and horribly designed. The complicated merges to get to Beauregard
	St from 395 or Seminary Road cause daily near-accidents with the few

commuters there are going to the area. Another 6000 commuters would create a bottleneck that would negatively impact my neighborhood and the entire 395 corridor.

Currently, when trying to access our

neighborhood from Seminary Road during rush hour, we have to wait several minutes at the light at Echols without a turn lane, hoping that those whizzing past won't rear-end us and crossing our fingers that the commuters waiting to get to the Seminary-Beauregard-395 intersection won't block the intersection. Even the turn lane at Dawes is a dangerous option since

Comments: many cars are trying to get to Columbia Pike or George Mason Drive and don't have the patience for those making the left turn. It's already hard for the citizens in Shirley Forest and Dowden Terrace to get in and out of the neighborhood.

I also have a suggestion that may ease the

traffic: make the facilities accessible by foot from our neighborhood and the surrounding areas. Currently our neighborhood is fenced off from Beauregard St and the commercial properties there. It is very dangerous to walk along Seminary Rd to Beauregard in rush hour because of the speed and density of the cars. Either insist that the office park take down the barrier fence so people may walk there or take out the scary bushes along Adams Elementary's sidewalk that leads to the Mark Center shopping center and Raymond. Taking out those cedar bushes would make the visibility better for walking commuters and students. A pedestrian bridge or VERY well marked crosswalks and the countdown walk-signs across Beauregard would be very effective.

I am upset that this issue was not resolved

already and that the City did not require the developer to have a more evolved plan before approval. The new facility is set to open next year and no improvements have been made in its anticipation. Alexandria needs to act now and insist that the developers move quickly BEFORE the heavy traffic starts.

I do believe that with effort the situation can be

resolved to the benefit of all involved.



Dear Mayor and Members of The City Council,

On Saturday, Dec 12, you may make a decision on how to handle the traffic fiasco that the BRAC project will bring to the West End area. There are several proposals on the table. One that is not mentioned, that ultimately will serve the whole area better is a fly over across Seminary road into Mark Center Drive between the Hotel and 4900 Seminary road. The proposals to have a entrance to the South garage that allows 300+/- cars an hour is shortsighted, especially when IDA future development is considered. Exiting the site during evening rush hour is going to be a nightmare.

It appears that in the haste to build, the Army has not taken into consideration the severity of the traffic situation.

Also, it is very curious that the Army still has not finalized their Transportation Management Plan (TMP).

This whole project needs to slow down because it appears that many things still need to be considered, i.e., the Beauregard small area plan is in early stages of development.

The City Council created this problem back in 2004 and failed to favor the Victory center site as the best place for the Army. The citizens of the West End have to live with this horrible decision. You did not listen to us then and you will have to make the best decision for our citizens now. City Council made the

decision to allow three left turns at Seminary and Beauregard - which controls the fate of the intersection. Perhaps delaying construction there is in order. You probably thought of all the tax revenue benefits prior to the Army's decision.

Any future development will have to be curtailed, including retail stores; if allowed it will only exacerbate the problem. 



Dear Mayor Euille and Members of the City Council:

On Saturday, December 12, you will vote on which options you want the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) to consider to accommodate future traffic from the BRAC project that borders on The Winkler Botanical Preserve. We represent Friends of Winkler, a large group of Alexandria citizens who strongly urge each of you to vote only for road options that leave The Winkler Botanical Preserve completely untouched.

As you know, on December 2 after hearing testimony from 28 citizens, the City Transportation Commission voted unanimously to recommend that Council select transportation options that do not cause harm to the Preserve. This includes consideration of Alternatives A-1 and A-2 from VDOT's seven preliminary alternatives for a new direct access route from I-395 to the site.

We have learned that among the options under consideration, VDOT is moving forward with exploration of Alternative A-1 as well as Alternative D. Alternative A-1 would not harm the Preserve as it would provide direct entry to the Army garage from the Seminary Road interchange. Alternative D would be devastating – this alternative involves constructing a road directly through the east end of the Preserve.

Regardless of the number of options presently before VDOT or City Council, the choice before those who will decide this is clear: some proposals leave The Winkler Botanical Preserve intact and still mitigate traffic, while others seriously impact the Preserve by destroying at least 30% of its property.

We strongly urge you to vote for proposals that do not take anything away from the Preserve, jeopardizing its mission. We understand that whatever the City recommends, VDOT plans to pursue study of Alternative D. Accordingly, we ask that your recommendation to VDOT include a strong statement against Alternative D and any alternatives that harm the Preserve.

Thank you for your careful consideration of this matter. You have the opportunity to support an environmental treasure that cannot be re-created in our city and to show our

children that you recognize the importance of nature and the environment to their education. Alexandrians are counting on you to do everything within your power to protect The Winkler Botanical Preserve.


