**SUBJECT:** CONSIDERATION OF AUTHORIZATION OF RECOMMENDED CAPITAL PROJECT ALLOCATIONS AND PLANNED EXPENDITURES

**<u>ISSUE</u>**: City Council authorization of the recommended capital project allocations and planned expenditures.

**<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>**: That City Council authorize \$5,832,400 for capital project allocations and planned expenditures for the capital projects as detailed in the Capital Improvement Expenditure Summary (Attachment).

**DISCUSSION:** This docket item provides a summary of Capital Improvement Program planned expenditures (Attachment). It includes projects reflected in the City's Fiscal Year 2011 Capital Budget approved by City Council, or approved in capital budgets prior to FY 2011 with a CIP budget document page reference in the Attachment.
