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I. <u>ISSUE</u>:

The applicant is requesting approval of a Certificate of Appropriateness for one double-sided hanging sign. The sign will be installed on the front bay, to the left of the middle window. The sign will be mounted on a black metal scroll bracket. According to the application, the bracket will be bolted into the building through the mortar. The sign will be of High Density Urethane and will measure 38" wide by 30" high. The background of the sign will be divided into gold, orange and black horizontal strips and will have white and black lettering. The sign will read, "About Face Aesthetic Centers & Izalia Laser Hair Removal".

II. HISTORY:

The two story brick building at 108 North Columbus Street was constructed between 1891 and 1896. The Victorian style building was constructed as a dwelling but was converted to office use several decades ago. The only record Staff could locate for prior BAR reviews for this property concerns the addition at the rear dating from 1976 (2/18/1976 & 3/17/1976).

III. ANALYSIS:

The proposed hanging sign complies with zoning ordinance requirements.

Staff believes the proposed sign conforms with the *Design Guidelines* for signs and is compatible with the Victorian era building at 108 North Columbus Street and the surrounding historic district.

IV. STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Therefore, Staff recommends approval of the application as submitted.
