ISSUE: Alterations

APPLICANT: Stephen Jacques

LOCATION: 318 Commerce Street

ZONE: CD/Commercial

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends approval of the application as submitted.

I. ISSUE:

The applicant is requesting approval of a Certificate of Appropriateness for new fencing at the freestanding rowhouse at 318 Commerce Street. The new fencing has several sections:

East side

At the north end (near Commerce Street) - new 3 ½' high wood fence, approximately 24' in length with a wood gate.

Rear of the dwelling – new 6' high wood fence 14' in length with two new gates This fencing will be board on board style.

South (rear) Side

New 8' high wood fence 24' in length with new gate This fencing will be board and batten style.

West side

At the south end - new 6' high wood fence 24' in length This fencing will board on board style.

All fencing with be either painted or stained.

II. HISTORY:

The wood frame two story, two bay, detached house at 318 Commerce Street was constructed in 1886.

In 1999 the Board approved a rear addition with the associated demolition (BAR Case #99-0086, 6/16/99) for this house.

III. ANALYSIS:

The proposed fencing complies with Zoning Ordinance requirements.

The Ordinance permits the Board to waive or modify fence requirements, including the six foot height limit for fencing, if the fence is deemed architecturally appropriate and consistent with the character of the historic district.

In the opinion of staff, the new fencing is appropriate to the historic character of the house and this area of the historic district. The proposed fencing meets the recommendations of the *Design Guidelines*. Further, staff has no objection to the installation of an 8' high wood fence at the rear of the property. The height of the fence will shield the rear from Duke Street and is minimally visible from a public right-of-way. Therefore, staff has no objections.

IV. STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval of the application as submitted.
