DISCUSSION:

Applicant s Description of Undertaking:

Railing on the front stairs install.

Issue:

The applicant is requesting a Certificate of Appropriateness to install a handrail on each side of the existing front steps. The handrails will be metal with a black finish. They will have simple pickets. The top rail will terminate in a lambs tongue. The applicant has provided a photograph showing railings at 424 Queen Street which the proposed railings will match.

History and Analysis:

The two story frame house with two story bay at 519 North Alfred Street is one of a row of 11 houses (509 through 529 North Alfred Street) which were constructed prior to 1902, the first year the area was included in Sanborn mapping, and may date to the last decade of the 19th century. Although one of the houses on the south end of the row (511 North Alfred Street) was no longer extant by 1907, the row represents one of the largest single developments of the Victorian period in the Parker-Gray District.

The proposed railing complies with the zoning ordinance requirements.

In the opinion of Staff, the proposed alteration is appropriate. The simple railing, though not necessarily Victorian in style, is unobtrusive and will not detract from the character of the house or its neighbors.
